

to Accelerate Development READ strategy to achieve the 23 Deliverables and 13 Pillars in Nigeria's Education Roadmap involves a comprehensive and collaborative approach would require taking some bold steps include establishing a central READ Coordination Office, mapping deliverables to READ pillars, fostering multi-agency collaboration, capacity building, technology integration for data management, stakeholder engagement, continuous monitoring and evaluation, inclusive education practices, resource mobilization, regular reporting, international collaboration, and aligning READ with local contexts. This strategic framework aims to ensure a unified, transparent, and culturally relevant

implementation, fostering a resultsoriented education reform agenda involving 25 education agencies in Nigeria.

Nigeria faces significant challenges in its education system, including a high number of out-of-school children, learning poverty, and weak coordination among stakeholders. To address these issues and enhance the effectiveness of education reform, the establishment of a dedicated READ Coordination Office is proposed. This office will serve as a central hub for coordinating, implementing, and monitoring education reform initiatives in Nigeria.
